

Natural Wonders will perform at the Cabbagetown Festival in Toronto on Sept 8, 2018 with an estimated combined audience of 83,000+ and media exposure of over 6 million. A public exhibition and special reception for sponsors and prominent politicians and celebrities will be held at Metro Hall Oct 11, 2018 where we will illuminate the dome ceiling. The event is designed for flowing audience of several thousand throughout the entire day and will feature live theme music and a podium for sponsor speaking opportunities.

42nd Annual Cabbagetown Cultural Festival

One of Toronto's largest festivals with attendance that has exceeded over 11,000 and continues to grow. Natural Wonders will be a main feature throughout the 2018 festival. While audiences come from across the city, the residents are primarily home owners with average incomes of \$80,000 +. Festivities will kick off with invited prominent politicians and celebrities including the Mayor, MPP and MP of Toronto Centre.

We anticipate an audience of over 2,000 throughout the day for a public performance of film and music that utilizes the planetarium style ceiling to project the northern lights. Prominent politicians and celebrities will lead guests on a circular tour allowing constant audience flow from 12 noon till 9 PM.
